

Weighted includes extra point for honors and AP classes.

Includes all coursework

Includes all classes with code ending P, A, H

AP Test Information

Step One: Enter Join Code on CollegeBoard.org before Nov. 8th

- Join Codes will be given to you by your AP Teacher. It is specific to your class period.
- If you are NOT enrolled in an AP Class but would like the option to take the exam, come to the Counseling Office for a Join Code. Must be done before November 8th

Step Two: Purchase your Exam on the Acalanes Webstore by Nov 8. Each Exam is \$110.

Exam dates May 5 - May 16

Students that need testing accommodations should come to the Counseling Office starting in September.

CSF reminder

CSF is an honor society and membership is based on semester grades. Students need to apply each semester. Students who are members at least 4 semesters from 10th-12th grades are recognized at graduation. Refer to the application form for eligibility and membership requirements.





Community Colleges

- Open Enrollment beginning February. Apply early.
- No SAT/ACT required
- Orientation in Spring
- Priority transfer to UC's and CSU's
- Honors Transfer Program
- Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG 6 Schools)
- Preparation for trades and apprenticeships
- Residential Housing available (11 California schools have this option)



Community Colleges

Some of the career training programs at Community college:

- Nursing: LVN, RN
- EMT, Firefighting
- Pre-apprentice and apprenticeships for trades including plumbing, steamfitting, carpentry, machine technology, welding and more
- HVAC, solar installation
- Culinary Arts
- Real Estate

Joining the Military - Things to Consider

- Different branches of military include Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines,
 Coast Guard will be visiting in Fall and Spring!
- Active duty military receive tuition assistance for college. Active and reserve members can use GI Bill for college.
- Military receive a salary, benefits, housing stipends if applicable, and skills training applicable to many civilian jobs.
- Options for joining include attending Academies, ROTC partnerships with 4-year colleges, the reserves and enlisting directly.

Types of Applications

UC Application

- Self reported grades (no transcripts)
- Activities and Awards list
- Personal Insight Questions (respond to 4 out of 8 questions - 350 word max)

CSU Application

- Self reported grades
- No initial transcripts but SDSU and Cal Poly may want mid-year transcripts

****NO letters of recommendation required

Common Application

- 800+ Schools
- Official test scores (depends on college)
- Activities & Awards
- Essay (Choose 1 of 7 options- 650 words
- Counselor Recommendation
- Teacher Letter(s) of recommendation

Other applications

Some colleges have their own online application (Georgetown)

Types of Application Review

Index Review

- GPA
- coursework
- Test scores (depends on college)











Holistic Review

- Academics
 - Grades, coursework, rigor
 - Standardized tests SAT or ACT (depends on college)
- Achievement outside the classroom (extracurricular activities, employment, volunteer work, etc.)
 - o Commitment and Leadership
- Context of High School achievements
- Personal Qualities essays and letters of recommendation
- Match/Fit and demonstrated interest





UC Application

- Application is Open Now!
- Filing period: October 1st-Nov 30 (Dec 2 in 2024!)
- Requires 4 personal Insight Questions (Choose from 8)
- No letters of recommendation
- No transcripts
- Test-blind for admissions (Test scores can be used for placement for admitted students.)





CSU Application

- Application online
- Filing period: Oct. 1st-Nov.30th
- NO: Essay or Letters of Rec
- No Activity List
- Test-blind for admissions (Test scores can be used for placement for admitted students.)





Private and Out-of-State Colleges

- Apply through college's website or Common App
- May require Supplemental Essays
- Resume of Extracurricular Activities
- Letters of Recommendation
 - Teacher
 - Secondary School Report (counselor)
- Mid-year report (updated transcript after 1st semester)
- Supplemental materials for specific schools
- Sync MaiaLearning with Common App by 1st signing FERPA on Common App





Recommenders and FERPA

Recommenders are people who will submit forms to colleges on your behalf. This page shows which recommender types this college needs. Each college will have different requirements.

(!) FERPA Release Authorization






Requesting Teacher Letter of Rec - Part 1






Put in your earliest deadline - Most common- Nov 1 or Nov 15

Ordering Transcripts





Request Transcripts on MaiaLearning.

Add colleges to your application list. You can also add NCAA

Check the application type

Transcripts will be sent after Sept. 1. Mid-year Reports will be sent after January 10.

Order transcripts from other schools (DVC, UC Scout, etc.) as well.

Letters of Rec - Reminders

- Check to see if teacher or counselor letters are required
- Ask counselor and teacher(s) at least 1 month before first deadline
- Only ask for letters you need.
- Invite teachers on MaiaLearning
- No invite feature for counselors- check Common App and Maia to see if you need one. If you do, please ask us directly.
- For Counselors: fill out Student survey on Maia Dashboard, have parents fill out parent survey. It's an assignment to them. Send us your activity list.
- Ask teachers what info they need--Brag Sheet?
- Thank your teachers and counselor for writing the letters.

ACT and SAT

SAT on Friday, Oct 18 for seniors only

Register on the webstore - deadline is September 9th

Use CollegeBoard.org to register for Saturday SAT tests at other locations.

Use ACTStudent.org to sign up for ACT

UC and CSU are no longer using test scores for admissions. Tests could be used for placement for admitted students.

- Many private colleges are test-optional
- October is last test date for early decision applications
- December is last test month for regular decision applications
- Students must send their test scores directly from testing company to colleges. AHS does not report test scores.

Financial Aid

FAFSA - Opens October 1 - everyone should fill out at fafsa.ed.gov

- FAFSA used for federal and state aid. Many colleges and scholarships use FAFSA info to determine need.
- CSS Opens Oct. 1 Many private colleges require this cssprofile.collegeboard.org
- Types of Aid: Need based, Merit, Grants, Loans, Work Study
- Use "Net Price Calculator" on school financial aid sites to understand Student Aid Index (SAI)
- Check college websites for deadlines
- <u>www.wiche.edu/WUE</u> --Western states discount

NCAA

- Register with eligibility center if you haven't already!
- Send transcript and official test scores to NCAA from Maia
- Core Course requirements
- Follow recruiting rules

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
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




Waiving FERPA Rights | Common App Steps




Things to Remember
